A. The following programs/facilities were identified by the workshop participants that should be considered as part of the program development.

- Retain existing Senior services and compliment (formerly Center was 10,000sf)
- BBQ & shade structure space
- Classroom priorities – celebrate community partners
- Technology
- Ballroom Dance Space
- Multigenerational – collaborative space
- Childcare – interactive
- Outdoor sports (not just passive)
- Multimodal – public transportation
- Art gallery; consider opportunities for existing museums to have small rotating display space to invite/connect potential visitors to their facilities.
- Kids, teens, seniors – interactive
- Connect to public health options
- Adult care/respite
- Tie in walking paths, gardens, experiences
- Coordinated tours, activities
- Locate to center of population/transportation (revenue generation)
- Community networking – connectivity
- Bocce – Patonk courts
- Arts lab creation + display + share + sell (shared revenue)
- Meditation garden – link with path experience

- Café for seniors separate from teens
- Growing demand (area needs growing)
- Fitness – dance (large)
- Playground
- Indoor celebration of spirit
- Banquet
- Amphitheater
