

**PLACER COUNTY AIR POLLUTION CONTROL DISTRICT
NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING
PROPOSED 2020 RACT SIP ANALYSIS REPORT AND
RULE NEGATIVE DECLARATION**

The Placer County Air Pollution Control District (District) proposes the regulatory action of adopting in a public hearing a 2020 Reasonably Available Control Technology (RACT) State Implementation Plan (SIP) Analysis Report, dated May 2020. The RACT SIP Analysis Report is required because the District is classified as moderate non-attainment for the 2015 Federal Ozone Standard. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (U.S EPA) Phase 2 Ozone Rule (40 CFR 51.912 and 70 FR 71612) requires that areas classified as moderate non-attainment or higher must demonstrate in a SIP that their rules fulfill RACT requirements for the ozone precursors volatile organic compounds (VOC) and nitrogen oxides (NOx), in accordance with Federal Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990 Sections 182(b)(2) and 182(f). The RACT SIP analysis determines the applicability of RACT requirements to emission sources in Placer County.

In support of the RACT SIP Analysis Report, the District also proposes the regulatory action of adopting a determination, and making the "negative declaration," that there are no major sources of VOC emissions in Placer County, and no emission sources in Placer County that exceed the RACT threshold established by US EPA Control Technique Guideline documents for the following industrial source categories: Aerospace Coatings, Automobile and Light-duty Truck Assembly Coatings, Dry Cleaning (Petroleum), Fiberglass Boat Manufacturing, Flexible Package Printing, Large Appliances Surface Coatings, Magnet Wire, Metal Furniture Coatings, Natural Gas / Gasoline Processing, Oil and Gas, Paper and Fabric, Paper, Film, and Foil Coatings, Pharmaceutical Products, Polyester Resin Manufacturing, Refineries, Rubber Tire, Ships/Marine Coating, and Synthetic Organic Chemicals

If adopted, the 2020 RACT SIP Analysis Report, dated May 2020, and the rule negative declaration, will be submitted as requested revisions to the SIP. All interested parties are advised of the opportunity to comment in writing on the proposed action or to attend the public hearing at the District's next scheduled regular meeting on June 11, 2020, starting at 2:30 PM.
